It is with sadness that AFC acknowledges the passing of Sid Tyler. Sid had a passion for the environment and for protecting natural open space land, and was a devoted friend of AFC.

Executive Director John Howell recalls, "Sid contacted me toward the end of our Millard campaign and said 'We have to save this land. How much do we still need?' With his help we saved Millard. At the start of the Cottonwood campaign he sat me down again. 'We're sending you a donation. It's critical we protect this land and wildlife corridor.' I asked him if I could share the news. After a pause he said 'Yes -- just save this land.' With another five-figure gift he got the ball rolling. We're well on our way, Sid.

"On a personal level I've known Sid since his first run for City Council in 1997. We became friends, and I was so fortunate for it. Principled, practical, selfless," John adds.

Betsey was Sid's perfect partner... and equally devoted to conservation. Our thoughts are with her as we continue to do their work.

AFC was honored by the **Pasadena Community Foundation** at their "Local Heroes Breakfast" with a \$25,000 award in commemoration of Sid. We appreciate the work of the Foundation, which also distributed funding to Pasadena Beautiful and 30 other deserving local non-profits.
