Patagonia Awards AFC \$12,000

Patagonia store employees voted to support our project to secure a 20-mile wildlife corridor from the San Gabriel Mountains above Hahamongna Watershed Park through the San Rafael and Verdugo Mountains and back up to the San Gabriels through Big Tujunga Wash and their vote resulted in a \$12,000 check!!!

TPL Partnership

Our hats are off to Tori Kjer and her staff in the Pasadena office of The Trust for Public Land (TPL). TPL engaged over 60 organizations to participate in the

OurParks campaign. They helped shape Measure A, get it on the ballot, and get the word out to the public. AFC was one of those groups, making certain that funding will be available for precious open spaces and wildlife corridors.
