Disney Conservation Fund Awards AFC \$50,000!

The Disney Conservation Fund awarded Arroyos & Foothills Conservancy \$50,000 to support our work in the Hahamongna to Tujunga Wildlife Corridor over the next two years.

Wildlife in Northern Los Angeles lives trapped by relentless development in isolated islands of open space. Animals suffer from in-breeding and territorial disputes, risking death by freeway if they try to cross to expand their range. The Hahamongna to Tujunga Wildlife Corridor Project aims to establish wildlife corridors allowing these animals to move freely to and from the San Gabriel Mountains. This critical project will secure unimpeded passage for wildlife between large areas of natural open space in a 20-mile wildlife corridor stretching from the San Gabriel foothills above the Arroyo Seco through the San Rafael Hills and Verdugo Mountains back to the San Gabriels through Big Tujunga Wash. It will connect fragmented open space and provide passage through and around heavily developed areas to increase the genetic diversity and health of wild populations.

The Disney Conservation Fund supports local efforts around the world aimed at saving wildlife, inspiring action and protecting the planet with more than \$75 million distributed to nonprofit organizations since 1995. Recent DCF grant recipients were selected based on their efforts to implement comprehensive community wildlife conservation programs, stabilize and increase populations of at-risk animals and engage communities in conservation in critical ecosystems around the world.

20,000+ View AFC's Exhibit at Descanso Gardens

AFC thanks Descanso Gardens, Executive Director Juliann Rooke and Director of Education Emi Yoshimura, for the opportunity to showcase what we do in their "Growing Habitat" exhibit over the summer. 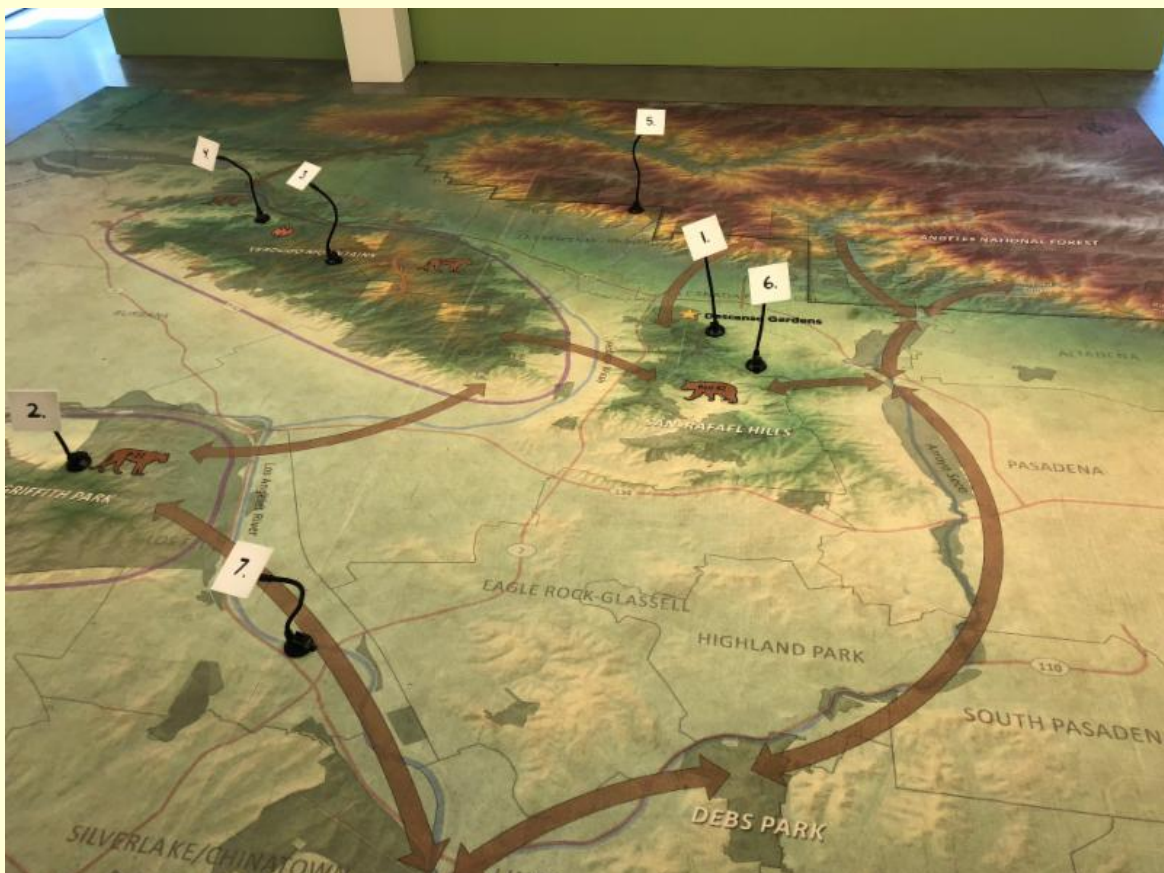

Athens Services Donates Roll-Off

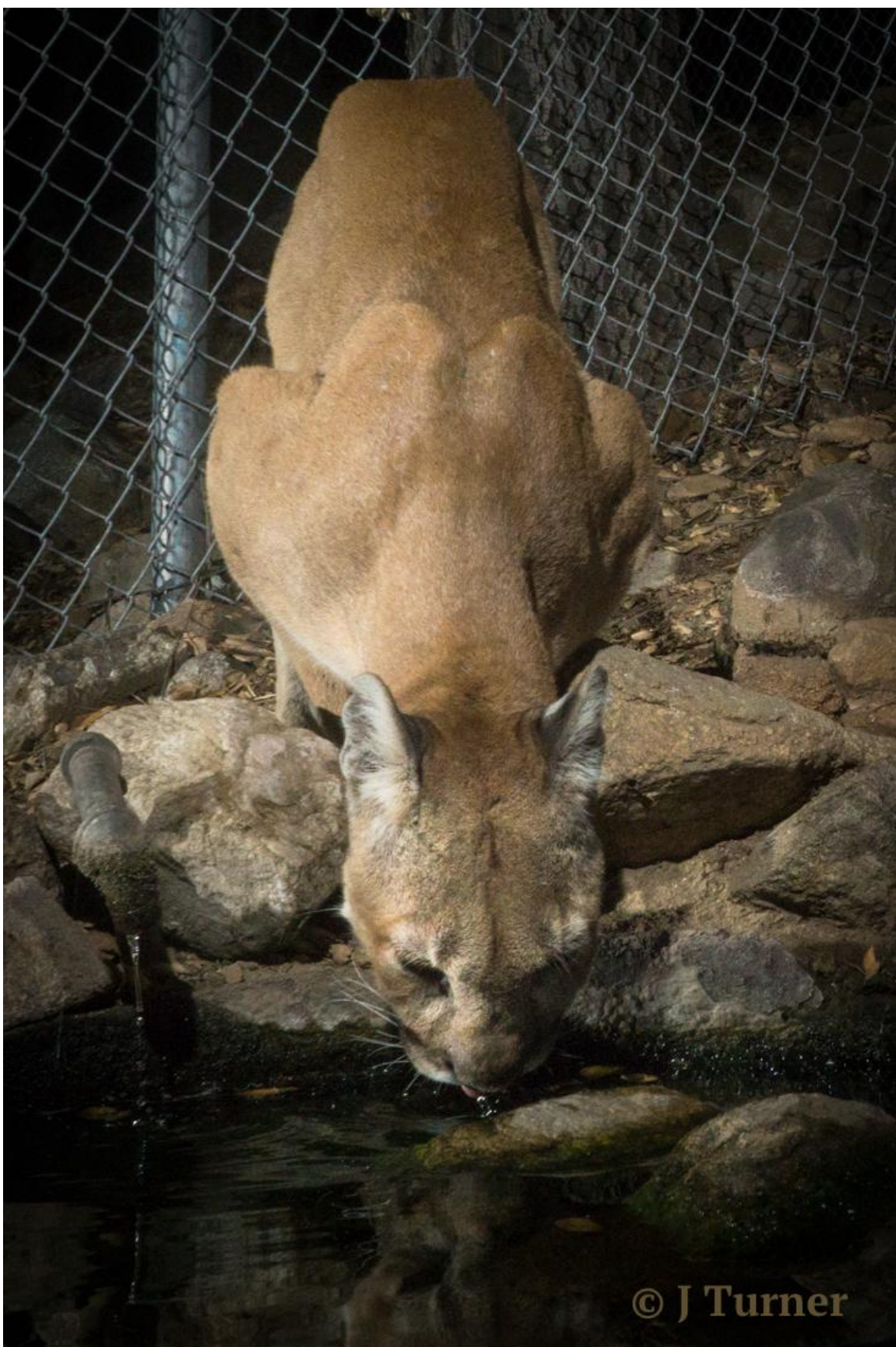
Special thanks to Athens Services for their generous donation of a 40-yard roll-off Dumpster to Rubio Canyon Preserve!
